MT. VERNON — Not even cold weather could keep attendees from the fourth annual Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce Home Show.

The Home Show ran from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday and will continue from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. today at Mt. Vernon Out-

land Airport.

According to event organizers, the first day of the show was nothing short of suc-

"It's been going really good," said Jamie Pruitt, marketing director of the Jefferson County Chamber of Commerce. "We've had a lot of people come through and we have a lot of vendors that we're excited about. We have 55 vendors. When it's cold you're always kind of worried, but we have a shuttle this year that's bringing people to the front door, I rode in it, it's super warm. We've had a really good

"We've been in Mt. Vernon since 1932, we started as an ice and coal company," he said, explaining the company's history. "Then as time progressed, ice and coal was dying out and we had to start transitioning. So we transitioned to a garden and rental center. We're at the Herb and Garden Show

at the mall and we're also here too. They're focusing on the garden at the herb show, and here at the home show it's all about do-it-yourself."

Brian Dillier of Marion came from out of town to showcase JMO Mobile Modular Containers. The containers are factory-built structures and can be permanent or relocatable.

"We've had people come in here for serious reasons and not just to look around," said DIllier. "We started this container business over 10 years ago ... just as a side company. Now we have over several hundred that are out there. We've gotten into making cabins out of them and mobile offices that people use for construction or for [a visiting relative] who needs a place to stay."

He indicated that another common use for the containers is as storm shelters.

New to the home show this year were demonstrations showcasing various activities including tae kwon do, laying

wood flooring and robotics.

"A lot of people have been coming in," said Wellmaker. "I've seen people from Centralia here, people from Effingham and Vandalia. Things are really looking good. We have a good diversification. There are two hangars with around 55 booths. We were overflowing from this hangar into the next hangar."
