Airport board owes Ill

MT. VERNON — The Airport Authority Board owes \$19,786.28 to the state for overpaid property tax reimbursements.

"[There's] still no official contact from the Illinois Department of Revenue with a plan of action. [However,] with our strong surplus each year, this overpayment does not affect our bottom lines," Chris Collins, the airport director,

Collins added that the overpayment is for three years.

According to an April 19 Illinois Department of Revenue press release 6,500 districts are affected and the overpayment was due to a misallocation of funds in the Personal Property Replacement Tax Fund in 2014.

According to the release, the PPRT was implemented during the Quinn administration and the PPRT are revenues collected by the state and paid to local governments to replace money that was lost when the 1970 Constitution amendment abol-

ished the ability of local estimated at \$513,210 governments to impose personal property taxes on corporations, partnerships and other business entities.

Other districts that owe the state include Mt. Vernon Township High School at \$85,443.13, Mt. Vernon City Schools District 80 at \$43,116.46 and the City of Mt. Vernon at \$25,231.75.
