Event concludes today with Balloon Fun Flight

MT. VERNON — Several hot-air balloons were seen high in the sky at Mt. Vernon Outland Airport over the weekend during the fifth annual

Gates opened at 4 p.m. Friday, and Airport Director Chris Collins gave his reaction to the start of the

"We have had a lot of questions leading up to it, a lot of phone calls from well outside of Jefferson County interested in coming," Collins said. "This is one of the best nights we have had for no wind."

Several activities were scheduled over the three-day event including laser tag, inflatables, tethered bal-loon rides, the Jefferson County Balloon Chase 5K run and a duck drop balloon flight, Young Eagles Rides, Vietnam Era Veterans Salute, "When Hogs Fly" fundraiser, a classic car show and much more.

The Friday night balloon glow was canceled due to weather, but the pilots had a plan by hosting what is called a "candlestick" where the baskets are brought out and burners shoot fire that would be used to light the balloon. People also had a chance to meet with the pilots during that time. A second balloon glow was scheduled for Sat-

urday evening.

This year's featured pilots and balloons were Mark Shoemaker in the Humbly Lifted, Keith Barry in the Highly Cool, Kevin Heinzeman in the Drifting Dolphins, Al Reusch in the Aeroknot, Tim Clody in the Son Light, Stephen Bennett in the Sun Kissed, Seth Goodman in the Honest Abe, Betsy Kleiss in the 4EVER39, Scott Wooge in the Eclipse, Jared Miller in the Fiery Gizzard Kurt Vitense in the Eden and Matt MCClinton in the Ridem 1.

According to Sentinel archives, Balloons Over Mt. Vernon was last held in October 2016, but, wanting to try and new schedule for the event, the Airport Authority Board of
