Annual Independence Day event set for July 4 at the Mt. Vernon Outland Airport

MT. VERNON — The Annual Salute to Freedom at the Mt. Vernon Outland Airport will be held on July 4 with gates opening at 5 p.m. and a shuttle from the parking area.

Clown will do a show on the stage at 6 p.m. followed by a performance by folk group Bringin' It Back at 7 p.m. Winners from the Little Miss and Mister 4th of July Pageant held on July 3 will be announced around 8:40 p.m.

"The Salute to Freedom was started by the Mt. Vernon Jaycees many years ago and I was on that committee...," said Mt. Vernon Outland Airport Board of Commissioners Chairman Mike Ancona. "I might add that we hand-lit the first fireworks that were out there. Nobody knows this. This whole thing was born on the porch of the old house where the Jaycees had their meetings underneath the water tower."

Ancona indicated that the Salute to Freedom began after a period in which Mt. Vernon had no Independence Day fireworks display.

"We all decided that it was a shame," he continued. "What we were reflecting on was the time when fireworks were shot off at City Park. Me being the age that I am, I remembered seeing those fireworks from my yard over

on Waltonville Road. Occasionally we would come over to the park when they were shot off. Everybody asked 'Why did we quit doing that?'

... We thought that we were going to revitalize Fourth of July fireworks. That was how it began."

To Ancona, the Salute to Freedom is a historic event and to see the event still brought to life every year resonates with him. Now the fireworks are deployed electronically rather than by
