## Airport offices now full

## Office suites at the Koziara Terminal at full capacity

MT. VERNON — Tuesday night the Airport Board approved a lease with Two Girls Cheesecake and Bakery bringing the terminal offices to full capacity.

"The building is now 100 percent occupied," said Chris Collins, airport manager. "This is the first time we have been full since the late 1970s, and the building was much smaller then. This is a historic moment."

Two Girls Cheesecake and Bakery, owned by Debbie Wuebbles and Jackie Weems, are leasing Suite 110 in the office area for \$100 per month.

"They have actually been here two years, moonlighting in the kitchen at (Wilkey's) during the restaurant off hours," Collins explained. "They decided it was time to have their own space at the airport."

The business supplies baked goods to individuals and to King City Books.

With the addition of the new lessee, the terminal now is home to Hertz, Leland Widick, Steve Willis, The Epilepsy Foundation, Kash Helicopters, Wilkey's Restaurant and Arista Cuts.

"We also have a counseling group that meets here in Wednesdays, and the YMCA has a karate class here on Thursdays," Collins added. "We have events throughout the week and the weekends."

In other business, the board:

- Approved the 2015-16 budget, showing total revenues of \$477,300 and expenditures of \$475,800, with \$125,521.22 cash on hand on April 30.
- Approved a small increase to dental insurance;

- Approved a bid from Jax Asphalt to continue the paving of Lakeshore Road to the picnic shelter at a cost of \$2,090;
- Approved a bid from Jax Asphalt to oil and chip Firebaugh Drive at a cost of \$4,866; and
- Discussed the MASLR
  Revitalization project, in which
  replace all the lead-in lights
  and towers for the airport. Work
  on FAA project will start June
  22. The project will replace towers, bases, concrete pedestals,
  lights and all equipment.
