MT. VERNON — Hot air balloons, war birds will be filling the skies at the Mt. Vernon Outland Airport for the Balloons Over Mt. Vernon & Fly-In.

"This year, I think people will notice the biggest change — bringing back the Little Egypt Fly-in to the event," said Jennifer Witzel, event coordinator. "Bringing back the aircraft piece is big."

The airport will be the setting for a weekend of activities Oct. 16 through 18 — a compliment to the Fall Fest with activities slated for the downtown area.
