MT. VERNON — Aircraft shoppers will have an opportunity to look at and test out a multitude of light aviation aircraft during the Midwest Light Sport Aircraft (LSA) Expo this weekend at the Mt. Vernon Outland Airport.

The expo will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. from Thursday to Saturday at the airport. The event offers free admission, free parking, and free

camping.

Airport Manager Chris Collins stated, "This is year eight, and as far as the LSA Expo is concerned, there is really no change. It still remains focused on putting the exhibitors and the shoppers together in

one convenient location."

According to Collins, there are typically 40 different exhibitors at the Expo with approximately 30 different airplane models. He said inside the airport terminal there will be more service related exhibitors.

Collins also said there will also be an exhibitor at the event called Etched Memories. He said the exhibit pertains to laser cutting images into glass cubes. Though the exhibit is not directly related to aviation, Collins said individuals who may not be interested in aviation may want to attend the expo to see
