

## ARC - Mt. Vernon, IL Stop #7

Mt. Vernon Outland Airport was one of eight stops on the recently concluded, 45th Annual, Air Race Classic. The Air Race Classic is the epicenter of women's air racing. Race teams, consisting of at least two women pilots, flew VFR during daylight hours only and were given four days to make flybys at each stop and then land at the terminus. The total course was over 2500 statute miles. Handicap speeds were determined for each aircraft and actual ground speeds were compared to the handicap speeds. Pilots strategized to play the elements, holding out for better weather, favorable winds, etc. Over 100 female pilots, from 35 States, five countries, and 13 colleges/universities were represented. KMVN was a previous stop for the ARC in 1990 and 1969 (Powder Puff











### **Best Stop Award**

KMVN was selected as the "Best Stop" at the conclusion of the 45th Air Race Classic (ARC). The "Best Stop" Award is voted by the actual racers themselves via a survey system. Points are awarded due to several factors such as: organized fueling process, ground crew assistance, hospitality/enthusiasm, food/drinks, and interest from the public.
